Across the Arab World, the so called "Arab Spring" is rapidly turning into a "Winter of Discontent", as the forces of evil and hard line Islamic militants seek to exploit the situation, not only to grab power, but to exploit the chaos and move against "Infidels" of other religious persuasions. There is no doubt that prior to the elections that brought the Muslim Brotherhood to power, assurance of freedom were given to untold thousands of "Secular Muslims" to win their votes, but once power was obtained, all such promises were forgotten. During President Morsi's year in office, some of his hard line allies increasingly spoke of Christians as "enemies of Islam". When the current waves of protest began, those parts of the media that was controlled by the Brotherhood alleged that this protest was dominated by Christians.



Much of what we see on TV is dominated by biased reporting from Cairo, portraying the Brotherhood as the victims. What is totally ignored is the plight of Christians in other towns and cities, where Christians tend to be known individually and are therefore easy targets. In these other places, splinter groups habitually break away and attack Churches, Hotels, Businesses and Homes belonging to Christians. We know that, to date, 82 churches of all Evangelical faiths have been burnt, and homes and businesses have been ransacked.

In Sohag, the demonstrators raised the Al Qaeda flag over the ruins of the church they had burnt. In the El Menia province a Catholic church was burnt along with three Christian schools, the mob then burnt the Evangelical church and continued by looting Christian homes. Near Minya a church elder was killed as he tried to reason with the mob to respect the house of God. The Bible Society shop in Assyut was destroyed and Bibles burnt. In Northern Sinai an Orthodox priest was kidnapped and found beheaded two days later. On the outskirts of Cairo, a 12 year old girl was attacked and killed as she left a Summer camp. In Luxor, four Christians were killed and homes were looted. Only history will reveal the true scale of the violence, but we expect that the toll will be well into the hundred, with thousands injured and made homeless.

Assemblies of God Incare want to make an urgent response to this unfolding tragedy and we are asking that our churches take offerings for this need as a matter of major importance. As always, we have trustworthy people on the ground who will distribute the aid to those who are most in need. Let us stand with our people in Prayer at this most strategic and critical time and let us demonstrate our concern for them by helping them practically in their time of great need.
